Mount Wachusett Community College and Worcester Technical High School agree to enter into a dual enrollment/articulation agreement in the following academic discipline:

CISCO Certification

This agreement is set forth by Mount Wachusett Community College and Worcester Technical High School in an effort to delineate a students' best options in course selection and transition to postsecondary education. It signifies the ongoing commitment between these two educational institutions to promote coordinated curricula of the highest quality. As such, it bears with it the commitment of our respective faculty, and administrative staff to strengthen these ties and address the needs of our students in a mutually beneficial manner. The parties shall work collaboratively in an effort to share resources, eliminate unnecessary duplications of instruction, identify and/or develop additional courses for students to obtain college credit, and develop a pathway for students to obtain additional industry certifications.

Acknowledging that students may, and do enter a wide variety of majors, this agreement does not prohibit admission to or from other programs of study at either institution. This agreement suggests optimal transfer routes from Worcester Technical High School to Mount Wachusett Community College.


CISCO Training


The parties agree to review and revise this agreement as necessitated by curriculum changes required by Cisco or either institution.

Beginning with the high school graduating class of 2008, students who are enrolled in Worcester Technical School High and who have successfully completed the Worcester Technical High School high school courses designated in this agreement as evidenced by the Certificate of Completion from Cisco shall be entitled to receive MWCC college credit for the equivalencies outlined below.

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APPLICATION PROCESS - DUAL ENROLLMENT

Applicants for dual enrollment under this program shall complete the MWCC admissions form entitled “High School Admissions” (no application fee required) and return the form to the MWCC admissions office. Upon application, students shall notify the MWCC Cisco contact (presently Jacqueline Feldman) of their intent to seek college credit for courses in which they are enrolled at WTNH. Upon completion of the course(s), the instructor shall submit the grade(s) to the MWCC records office.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

A student who is not dual enrolled, but has completed the courses outlined above at Worcester Technical High School who after high school graduation wishes to seek credit, will request that an official high school transcript be sent to the MWCC Enrollment Center with a copy of the Certificate of Completion from Cisco or verification from the instructor that the student has satisfactorily completed such course in accordance with Cisco standards. The Records office will enter a grade of P (passing) for the equivalent MWCC courses listed above upon receipt of this verification.
